OVERVIEW OF THE PROJECT

- Learning Experience for USD 204 Students
- All Murals are Temporary
- Art is in the Eye of the Beholder



GENERAL RULES

1. Eligibility

a. BSHS Student

2. Design Submission

a. USD 204 Approval

3. Theme Guidelines

a. community pride, positivity, and creativity

4. Final Approval

a. USD 204 and the City reserve the right to request changes or deny design

GENERAL RULES

1. Supervision Required

- a. By USD 204 Approved Staff Member

2. Scheduled Work Times

- a. For supervision; prevent vandalism

3. Materials Provided

- a. By USD 204 or Students
- b. Materials **MUST** be approved by the City
 - i. Cannot add texture to the building.

4. Ladders & Scaffolding - **NOT ALLOWED**

CONSIDERATIONS FOR MURAL LOCATIONS

1. Potential for Damage

- a. Accidental painting of window frames or unpainted brick
- b. Paint spills on concrete
- c. Damage to existing landscaping

2. Accessibility

- a. Consideration of the sloped ground between the Community Center and Maple Street

COMMUNITY CENTER PONY WALL

- USD 204 may divide space as needed.
- Drainage holes must remain uncovered.
- Murals must maintain a 3-inch clearance from unpainted brick.
- Groundwork (e.g., moving dirt) is not allowed.

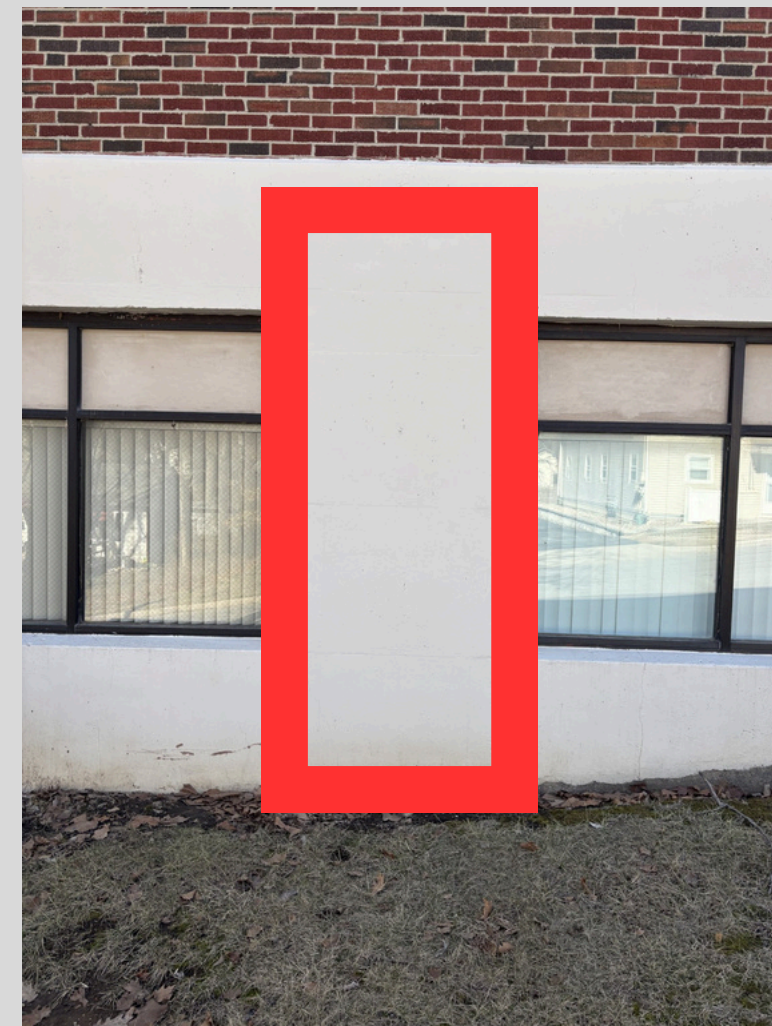
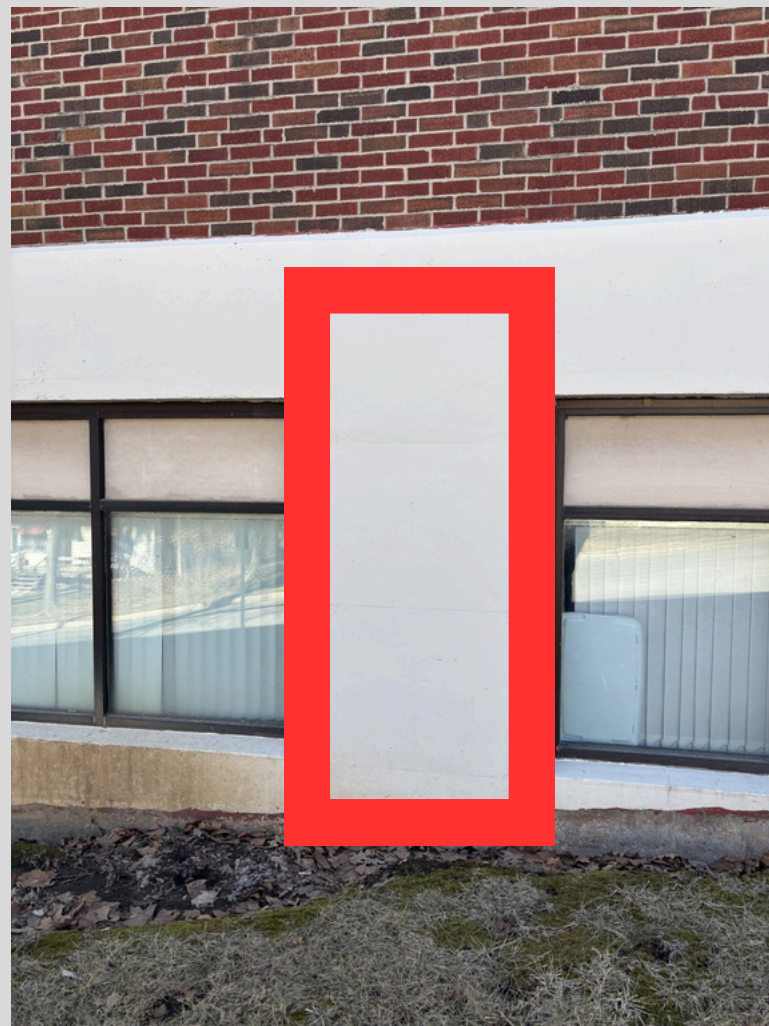


ELM STREET – COMMUNITY CENTER (THREE AREAS BETWEEN WINDOWS)

- One mural per section is recommended.
- Murals must maintain a 3-inch clearance from window frames and unpainted brick.
- Murals should not exceed window height.

ELM STREET – COMMUNITY CENTER (UNDER THE STAIRWELL)

- Three murals are recommended.
- Murals must maintain a 3-inch clearance from window frames, door frames, and light fixtures.
- Painting of the stairwell and railing is NOT allowed (support structure painting is negotiable).



*Light Fixture

ACCESS ROAD – COMMUNITY CENTER (BETWEEN SENIOR CENTER OFFICE WINDOW & SIDE ACCESS DOOR)

- Two murals are recommended.
- Murals must maintain a 3-inch clearance from window frames, gutters, electrical boxes, and unpainted brick.
- The covered entry and its supports are **NOT** included in the painting area.
- Piping and wire housing **CANNOT** be painted.



*Light Fixture

ACCESS ROAD– SENIOR CENTER POOL ROOM (REQUIRES COUNCIL APPROVAL)

- Most visible option
- City Council approval is required due to its proximity to concrete and landscaping risks.
- Murals must maintain a 3-inch clearance from window frames, gutters, light fixtures, and unpainted brick.
