Public Use Request - Mobile Pet Vaccination Clinic at the Bonner Springs Farmer's Market - Bonner Springs Farmer's Market and Bonner Springs Animal Control submitted a Public Use Request for Saturday, October 23, 2021 from 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. for a Mobile Pet Vaccination Clinic. The request includes closure of only the east side of Elm Street from Front Street to Second Street. The portion of second street shown on the included map is already closed for the Farmer's Market and does not need additional approval. The closure will not prevent access to homes or businesses along Elm Street.

Appointments to Boards and Commissions - Library Board - Appoint John Mackey to fill the position vacated by Amanda Lillig for a term ending April 2022.

Acceptance of Public Sanitary Sewer Easement - Mackey moved and Shannon seconded to accept the dedication of easements and rights-of-way indicated in the included exhibit. The approximate location of the easement is 611 West Second Street. Unanimous approval.

SUP-04-21; Special Use Permit for 4119 Bonner Industrial Drive - Mission Trucks, LLC - Shannon moved and Stephens seconded to approve an ordinance granting a Special Use Permit for Mission Trucks, LLC at 4119 Bonner Industrial drive. Unanimous approval. Assigned Ordinance No. 2513.

Uniform Development Ordinance Agreement - Freese and Nichols - Gurley moved and Shannon seconded to

approve entering into a contract with Freese-Nichols, Inc. for Phase I of the Uniform Development Ordinance (UDO) for an amount not to exceed \$45,000. Unanimous approval.

Unanimous approval. Assigned Ordinance No, 2512.

City Council Items - Reeves

- City staff did a wonderful job cleaning up Spring Creek.
- The Cemetery pond looks great but the trimming has progressively gotten worse.
- Requested the Cemetery Advisory Board begin meeting in February instead of March in 2022.
- Noticed the fire truck is back at the business on Front Street without registration. The City Manager noted the vehicle was repaired and registered properly and the Code Enforcement Officer has advised the business owner that the temporary tag needs to be on the vehicle,
- Stated the Code Enforcement Officer is doing a good job and the city is improving.
- The parking spots on Second Street between Cedar and Maple obstruct the sidewalks.
